ine entries are unclued. Three of them, theme-words A, B; and C, are linked in a familiar way. Each theme-word has two variations. The variations are different in each case. For example, if the theme-words were PEPPER and SALT, the variations might be ENERGY and APIECE (definitions of component parts of PEP-PER) in the first case, and WATER and TALKS (the latter half of phrases beginning with SALT) in the second case.

Clue answers include three proper nouns and one abbreviation; 16A is a variant and 11D and 24D are uncommon. As always, mental repunctuation of a clue is the key to its solution. The solution to last month's puzzle appears on page 55.
